Israel Launches Operation "Cast Lead" Against Hamas

U.S. Senate Supports Israel's Gaza Incursion

On January 8th, by a non-binding resolution, the U.S. Senate voiced strong support for Israel's battle against Hamas militants in Gaza, while urging a ceasefire that would prevent Hamas from launching rockets into Israel.

Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid said before the vote, "When we pass this resolution, the United States Senate will strengthen our historic bond with the state of Israel, by reaffirming Israel's inalienable right to defend against attacks from Gaza, as well as our support for the Israeli-Palestinian peace process."

Noting that Israel was bent on halting Hamas rocket fire into its southern towns, Reid said: "I ask any of my colleagues to imagine that happening here in the United States. Rockets and mortars coming from Toronto in Canada, into Buffalo New York. How would we as a country react?"

Co-sponsor and Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell said, "The Israelis ... are responding exactly the same way we would." The vote expressed an "unwavering" commitment to Israel's welfare and recognized its right to act in self defense to protect citizens against acts of terrorism.

On Dec. 27th, the sixth day of Hanukkah, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) launched Operation Cast Lead with the aim of striking the infrastructure of the Hamas terrorist organization as a result of the relentless terror attacks perpetrated by Hamas from the Gaza Strip and the continued firing of missiles at Israeli citizens.

The Israel Air Force began the operation by attacking terrorist targets including

weapons smuggling tunnels, rocket launching sites, and a weapons and ammunition storage facility. The Israel Navy participated by striking targets that included storage facilities, Hamas outposts, tunnels used to transport weapons and terrorists, various launching squads, and weapons and rocket manufacturing sites.

The IDF struck the houses and outposts of senior Hamas operatives and targeted buildings in the Hamas government complex located in Tel Al-Hawa that were the center of the Hamas government operations, including the financial and organizational planning of terror attacks, destroying the offices of the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Labor Ministry and the Ministry of Housing and Construction. The IDF also hit mosques that stored Kassam and Grad rockets and other weaponry.

The IDF announced that it sustained casualties both from combat and from "friendly fire" incidents. It reported that Hamas frequently fired at Israeli territory and IDF forces from within schools and by using civilians as human shields.

The IDF reported killing senior Hamas operatives, including the head of the Hamas rocket launching program in Jabaliya and the commander of Hamas' Gaza City area rocket launching program.

Military officials, speaking on condition of anonymity because operational plans had not been made public, said the army has a contingency plan for a fourth phase — the full reoccupation of Gaza and toppling of Hamas.

Israel withdrew from Gaza in 2005 after 38 years of military occupation.



Hamas Fires Missiles Attempting to Hit IAF Warplanes Flying Over Gaza

Israeli defense officials reported that Hamas gunmen have made several attempts using antiaircraft missiles to hit Israel Air Force jets attacking targets in the Gaza Strip since the start of Operation Cast Lead. Air Force pilots know the clear threat against them and have been ordered to act in accordance with routine safety rules.

The IDF jets, and especially the assault helicopters, have been subject to missile threats in the Gaza Strip for a long time. The matter has become more urgent during Operation Cast Lead in light of the great number of IAF aircraft flying over the Gaza Strip. A vehicle carrying an antiaircraft missile launcher was attacked in an Air Force strike in Gaza.

Hamas has been claiming for a long time that its fighters are using machine-guns against Air Force jets flying over Gaza. At the end of 2007, Hamas' military wing – the Izz al-Din al-Qassam Brigades – claimed for the first time that its men had used antitank weapons against IAF jets. IDF officials believe that the arms smuggled over the years through the Philadelphi route tunnels include anti-tank and anti-aircraft weapons.



Murbarak: Wants an Israeli Victory in Gaza

On January 5th, Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak stunned visiting foreign ministers in Cairo when he said he wanted Israel to emerge as the winner in the current conflict in Gaza.

European foreign ministers, headed by Karel Schwarzenberg of the Czech Republic, met with Mubarak before traveling on to Jerusalem for a meeting with Israeli Foreign Minister Tzipi Livni. At that meeting the ministers confided that Mubarak had told them 'Hamas must not be allowed to emerge from the fighting with the upper hand.'

In Israel, Bloomberg Shows His Support



New York Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg was in Sderot in early January when a public-address system warned of a rocket attack. With shouts in Hebrew and English, the mayor was whisked by Israeli and American guards into a protected room. The rocket, and a second one, missed the town. Mr. Bloomberg later played down the event. "Let's not overstate the risks to me," he added. "The risks are to the people of Sderot, on the ground, in their homes, in their businesses." In Sderot, Mr. Bloomberg visited a house that suffered a direct hit from

a Hamas-launched rocket just four hours earlier. Mayor Bloomberg also visited the underground pediatric department of the Barzilai Medical Center in Ashkelon, where he met with children and passed out stuffed toys (picture).

Mr. Bloomberg flew to Israel to express support. He landed the morning after Israel's assault in Gaza began. "I think I speak for an awful lot, almost all Americans, who think that Israel is doing the right thing in defending itself," he said in Ashkelon, offering a message of unequivocal support he would repeat throughout his visit.
